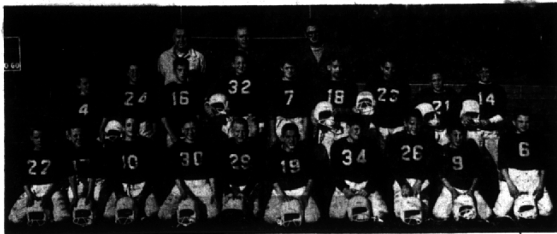

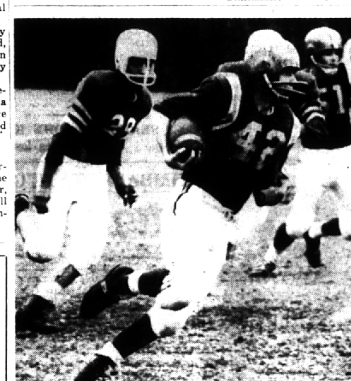

Country Day Compiles 5-3 Grid Record

Detroit Country Day wound up one of its best years in football competition, even though they dropped a 20-13 decision to Whitmore Lake Saturday.

The Yellow Jackets ended with a 5-3 mark under new head coach Larry Masteller, who came to Country Day via Constantine where he compiled an unbeaten string last year.

In the second stanza, the winners added another to make it 20-7 before Country Day got one back in the fourth quarter on a 25-yard pass from quarterback Gary Hourhan to John Swain.

The Yellow Jackets gave it a go in the final minute, diving to the Whitmore 30 before giving over the ball on a fourth down try.

MARKS LED the Country Day ball carriers and Jeff Bisage was a mainstay on defense.

In their three losses on the year, the Yellow Jackets were beaten by only a total of 19 points.

Northwood Bowlers Shatter 10 Records

Birmingham's highest scoring league, the Northwood Lanes Senior House, really opened up last week. By the time the last pin had fallen, 10 new season records had been established in the biggest rash of scoring seen this season in the area.

Sharing high team honors were first-place Michigan Machine Rebuilders and second-place L & L Shell. Machine fired a season high series of 3,155 on games of 1,041, 1,027, and 1,087 to sweep four from the luckless Torrence Oil squad which rolled 1,007 in 2,918.

Wiley Wendell led the Machine men with 247, 258 in 689, followed by Joe Frey's 222, 222, 225 in 670. Vern Wendell's new season high game of 279 in 617, and Capt. Bob Costwe's 210, 205 in 596.

High individual series of the match, however, was rolled by Torrence's Joe Kiley. Starting slowly with a like-warm 191 game, Kiley found the "pocket" and scored games of 252 and 250 to post the second highest series of the season—693.

VINCENT FIVE FIRED a second game of 1,004 yet lost by 121 pins as L. & L. Shell bombed a new season high game of 1,125 in 2,961 to sweep all four points. Individual scores in Shell's 1125 game were Andy Klaker's 257, Ray Kourec's 225, Bob Manser's 219, Bob Perry's 212, and Larry Milford's 212.

High men for the match were Shell's Milford with 212, 225 in 627, Klaker with 257 in 613, and Kourec with 202, 225 in 615 and Vincent's Bob Vincent with 203, 224, 204 in 631.

Ron "The Bomb" Israel rolled the highest series of his career, a new season high series of 718, to pace his Northwood Lanes team to games of 1,016, 1,005 in 2,977.
