General Motors Sets New Nine-Month Record in '64

General Motors' sales, net income, earnings per share and dividends for the first nine months of 1964 established new records.

On Sept. 25, 1964, just prior to the end of the third quarter, the UAW AFL-CIO began a national strike against General Motors.

EARNINGS WERE after provisions for United States and foreign income taxes of \$160 million in the third quarter of this year and of \$215 million in the same quarter last year.

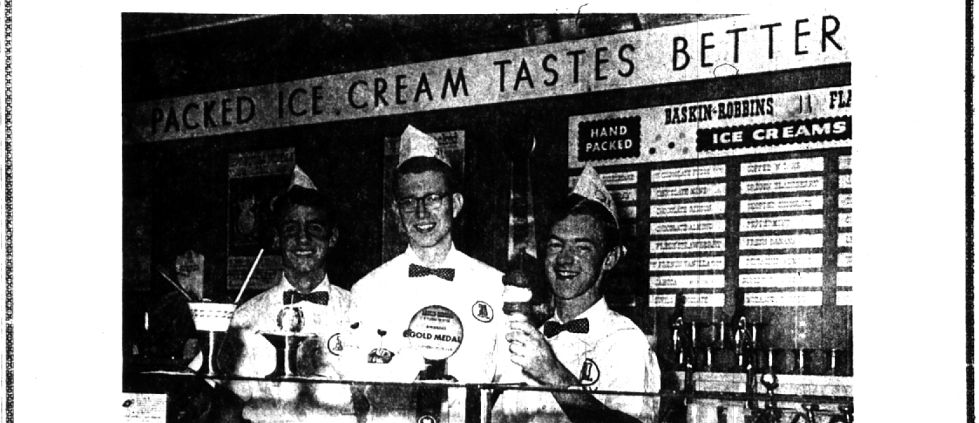
