B'field School 'Adopts' Girl

The City and Country School of Bloomfield Hills has financially "adopted" Maria Lopo, a 14-year-old Italian girl, through Foster Parents' Plan, Inc., 352 Park Avenue South, New York, N.Y.

"Adoption" isn't legal, it's strictly personal. The child is told only that his Foster Parents are soon as he is "adopted". He writes a letter every month. Original and translation are transmitted by PLAN. His Foster Parents visit monthly and their letters are often the child's most treasured possession.

Maria's family lives in poverty in a small town of southern Italy. It is called Ortona and is in the Abruzzi mountains, actually on a hill close of the Adriatic coast. The girl and some of her family depend on fishing and farming for their living. There is never enough work for them, and many, many of the men go to other cities or to other countries to find work that will give them a decent living.

Maria's own father had gone to West Germany to work, and was just getting established. He had come home on brief visit to his family in December, 1962. He was killed in a traffic accident, said to be his own fault. There was no indemnity for the family for this reason. They were shocked with grief and they were left with very little to live on.

MARIA HAS four brothers, Carmine (16), Domenico, 10, Antonio, 4, and his twin, Gino. Their mother applied for a social security pension, but so far none has been received. (If she does receive one it will amount to no more than 67c a day.) Carmine is going to vocational school. Domenico is in an orphanage-type school, without cost to his mother, and to relieve the bitter poverty of his home.

Her mother herself has always tried to find work, though she is needed at home to care for the twins, especially. She is in poor health, too. From time to time she can get some work of cleaning or washing for neighbors. They are themselves very poor people in this town, and they can pay only in a little for some used clothing for the children or herself. There had been some savings, and they have lived mostly on this. Now they are some of the most desperate need, and almost without hope.

They live in a 2-room flat on the first floor of a cheap tenement building, home of the poorest. Rent costs \$2.50 a month. They cook with either firewood or bottled gas, at a monthly cost of \$1.00. Electricity costs 45c a month.

In the cold of a mountain and seaside winter, when the winds can be brutal, they have to depend on neighbors for some extra firewood for heat. Furnishings are the few needed pieces, all scarred and shabby. They need bedding and blankets and clothing very badly.

MARIA HAS BLUE eyes and blonde hair; she is pale and anemic. She usually does well in school, but in the past year, her work has suffered because she had to help her mother in taking care of the twins, and also she suffered from shock at her father's death.

She is in the fifth grade. She is friendly and affectionate, and is a serious girl for her age. She likes to read and sew. Maria would love to have some books and also some clothes.

PLAN aid provides a monthly cash grant of \$8, clothing, supplies and special medical care. It offers encouragement and advice and help from our social workers and director for Maria and her whole family. Maria says she hopes to continue her studies, even into secondary school, and PLAN aid will assure her of this opportunity.
