White House Aide To Speak on Retardation Help

The assistant to President Johnson in charge of mental retardation is coming to Oakland County next month for a major public appearance.

He is Dr. Stafford Warren, internationally-known physician and medical educator, who was summoned to the White House by President Kennedy in May, 1963, to direct implementation of recommendations of the President's Panel on Mental Retardation.

Dr. Warren's appearance will come at a luncheon on Saturday, Dec. 12, in Royal Oak Kimball High School as the highlight of a Public Information Day Program sponsored by the Oakland County Council for Retarded Children.

Woods, chairman of the Council which represents all parent groups in Oakland County, said:

"IT IS A HIGH compliment to have a man of Dr. Warren's ability and position to accept our invitation. He is a foremost leader in developing programs to widen services to the retarded."

Under the new state constitution, legislators cannot serve in two public offices simultaneously in order to avoid any conflict of interest. College President John E. Tirrell said the college board has the power to appoint Smart's replacement to serve until his completed term expires.

There is some question on the exact term of office college trustees are serving as the trustees were elected by the voters in June for unspecified terms.
