## Mrs. E. W. Pellegrini

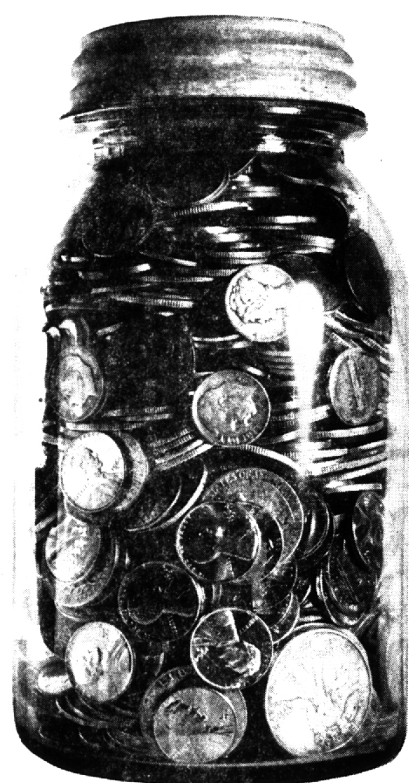
