### New Director Named At Church of Christ

Roy Y. Palmer has been named new educational director of the Birmingham Church of Christ. He began his duties with the congregation on Nov. 15.

Palmer, Dean of Michigan Christian College, is well-qualified to serve as an educational director of the church. He is not only an educationally trained man, but he has been preaching and doing mission work for several years. He served for about five years on the faculty of Abilene Christian College, Abilene, Tex., as a member of the Bible faculty.

Following this, he went to Southern Rhodesia, Africa, where he directed a religious training school. In 1947, along with Otis Galwood, he pioneered in missionary work in Germany. While there, he began and directed a religious training school in that country.

AS DEAN OF MICHIGAN Christian College, he not only directs the religious training of the Bible Dept., but also serves as academic Dean of the Liberal Arts departments of the College.

Palmer began his work with the Birmingham Church last Sunday morning by delivering the morning sermon at the worship hour. He will be in charge of the Sunday School, the Mid-Week Bible Classes and all other educational activities of the congregation.

Along with Morris M. Womack, minister of the church, and Richard Hackett, director of Visitation, he will work closely with the elders of the congregation in the development of the congregation's attempt to serve the Birmingham community.

Palmer's retention by the elders is another of the planned steps of a 10-year program mapped out by the elders and given to the congregation two years ago.

The elders, Homer Cass, Albert Estinger, Guy H. Lee, Thomas Tolbert and Wheeler Drey, have all been with the congregation for a number of years, most of which time they have served as leaders in the congregation's programs.

At Community Congregational Church of Lathrup Village, the children will remember the people at the Evangelical Home for Children and the Aged in Detroit, with a harvest of canned goods.

The adults will take part in a special Thanksgiving offering Sunday for the mission projects of the church. In the evening at 7 p.m., the congregation will share in the Forefather's Day Festival at North Congregational Church.

Thanksgiving Eve, the Chancel Choir will take part in the area's combined Thanksgiving service at St. David's Episcopal Church.
