Wells College opened a \$2,500,000 Centennial Fund campaign for 1964-65 with the announcement of \$890,000 in ad-

vance gifts and pledges from the Board of Trustees. The total goal of the college's development program is \$6,200,000, to be raised by 1968 when the college will be 100 years old.

Objectives of the campaign are a new library and dormitory, a hall of music, modernization of existing buildings, and endowment for scholarships and faculty salaries.

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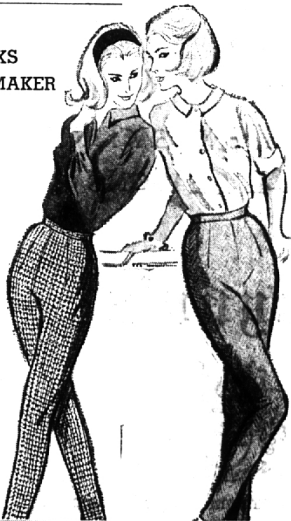
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
