

Seaholm Offering Madrigal Event

Music of the 16th century will be featured at the Madrigal Festival in the Seaholm High School Little Theater this evening.

Dr. Walter Collins of Oakland University, Rochester, will be commentator on the compositions to be performed. Dr. Collins is considered an authority on the music of Thomas Weelkes, 16th century composer.

The program will begin at 5 p.m. and center around the dinner hour—a common practice during the golden age of madrigal music.

APPROXIMATELY 20 madrigal ensembles from various high schools in the area will be participating.

The festival is being sponsored by the Michigan State Vocal Association. Hosts for the program are the Seaholm Madrigal Singers and director William Seeback. Introductory comments will be made by Ross McCord, principal of Seaholm High School.

Also planned on the program will be a directors' ensemble made up of the conductors of the several participating groups.

OU Appoints Biologists to Department

With the appointment of two cell biologists from Eastern universities, Oakland University has added biology to its liberal arts-centered curriculum.

Joining the faculty this year as professors of biology are Clifford V. Harding from the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons faculty, and Walter L. Wilson from the University of Vermont's College of Medicine. Both have worked extensively on research in cellular physiology.

UNDER THEIR direction, the OU biology program has been designed for liberal arts and secondary teaching majors.

According to Harding, who is chairman of the new department, the liberal arts emphasis will prepare students for graduate work, or further training for careers in medicine, dentistry and allied fields.

The two biologists plan to continue foundation-supported research projects in the Oakland labs. For several summers they have joined other scientists in research at the Marine Biological Laboratory, located at Woods Hole, Mass.

They plan to maintain their affiliation with that biological center.

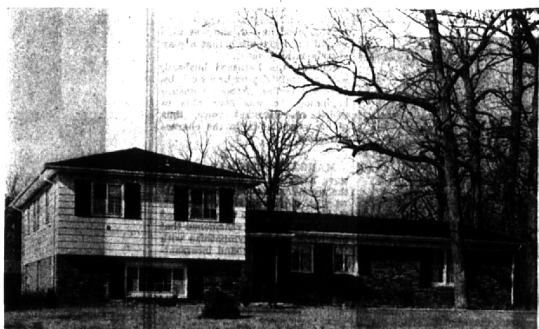
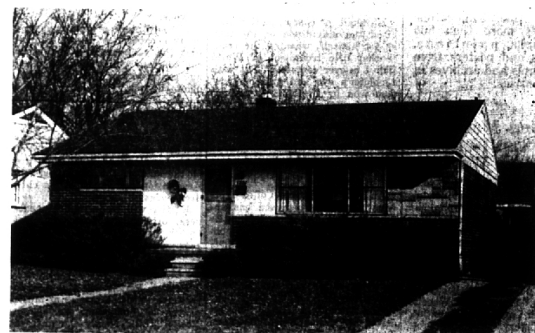

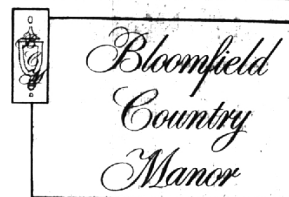

Country Day Hosts Scientific Exhibit

A demonstration lecture program, "This Atomic World," will be presented in an assembly program at radio-activity, radiation biology Detroit Country Day School on Nov. 20. The program, sponsored by the United States Atomic Energy Commission, is presented by the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, Oak Ridge, Tenn.

Subjects to be covered include atomic structure, the nucleus and atomic activity, radiation biology and fusion and fission. The uses of radiotopes are also included. The application of these isotopes in agriculture, industry, and medicine is an important aspect of the non-military use of atomic energy.
