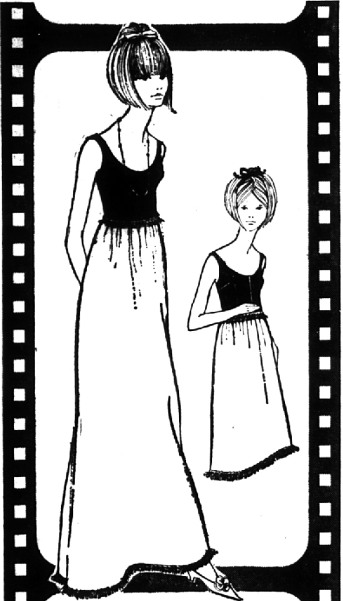


Brownie Troop Visits Cranbrook

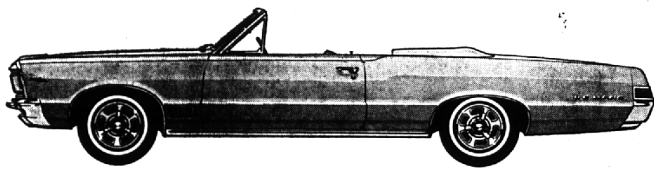
