

Car-Bus Crash Injures Teens

Two teen-agers sustained minor facial injuries Monday morning when the car in which they were riding crashed into a Bloomfield Hills school bus at Square Lake and Lahser.

William K. Basinger, 19, of Clarkston, the driver, and Susan Brown, 19, of Sylvan Lake, a passenger were treated at St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital, Pontiac, and released.

Neither Otto King, 49, driver of the school bus, nor any of his student passengers were injured.

According to township police, the school bus was attempting a left turn from Square Lake onto Lahser when the accident occurred at 9 a.m.

B'ham Approves Rezoning on Grant

Schedule Final Hearing For Hills High School

A motion to dismiss a suit against the Bloomfield Hills School District has been denied in Oakland County Circuit Court.

The request for a summary judgment in the suit, lodged by five couples in the Lahser-Hickory Grove area to block a second high school, was turned down Monday by Judge Frederick C. Ziem.

JUDGE ZIEM ruled that it was a "close question" and set the date for a final hearing on Jan. 14. He ruled in favor of Bloomfield Township in its request for dismissal as a defendant in the suit.

The judge also granted a partial summary judgment to the Oakland County Road Commission, which was also named as a defendant. The road commission, Ziem said, will not have to prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost for widening Lahser or improving intersections near the school site.

EFFORTS to halt construction of the high school were first made in August after the board of education indicated its intent to erect a \$2.3 million building on a 40-acre site on the west side of Lahser, be-

Twp. Requests Traffic Signs

Superior Home Case of Bloomfield Township has been authorized to negotiate with the Oakland County Road Commission for signs to regulate the speed in two of the township's subdivisions.

The board learned Monday night that nonresident motorists are using the streets of Bloomfield Farms subdivision to bypass the back-up of traffic at the Maple-Telegraph intersection.

THE COUNTY road commission has suggested that the problem can be alleviated with the installation of speed signs plus yield and stop signs at strategic points in the areas most used by the motorists taking short cuts.

Case also will discuss with the road commission the installation of six yield signs in Bloomfield Village. These will be placed at the intersections of Pine and Glenhurst and Pine and Waddington.

The Pine-Glenhurst intersection has been the scene of an unusual amount of traffic accidents, Case said.
