## Teachers Needed For Jobs Abroad

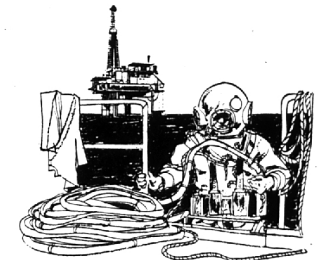
