Father Joseph Dustin, the banjo-playing priest, is to appear at Marian High School, Wednesday, Dec. 16, at 8 p.m. Marian Mothers' Club is presenting the program, proceeds of which are to be used for purchase of equipment for the school's inside circuit television studio. For as long as he can remember, Father Dustin, a Roman Catholic priest in the Redeemptorist Order, has been interested in music and the theatre. His mother was a professional singer, church organist, choral director and leader of a 15-piece band.

HIS FATHER toured the Orpheum vaudeville circuit as a song-and-dance man and later became one of the pioneer motion picture producers in the days of the early silent films. That Father Dustin's first recording, "Songs Father Taught Me," was a huge success was no surprise to citizens of Detroit, for in Detroit, as Time Magazine reported in the summer of 1961, "Father Dustin is as well known for his accomplishments on the banjo as he is for his work at the Holy Redeemer Church." After a decade and a half of service in Detroit, Father Dustin was transferred late in 1961 to St. Michael's in Chicago.

SOME OF the national television shows on which he has appeared are "What's My Line", "To Tell the Truth" and the "Tonight" show. In Detroit he has performed at the American Festival of Music in Cobo Arena and at Detroit's Town Hall in the Fisher Theatre. He also appeared with Alan King at Cobo Hall at a muscular dystrophy benefit performance. Father Dustin demonstrates the capabilities of the plectrum banjo by playing musical numbers ranging from the refined jazz of Gershwin to the dixieland variety.

PROCEEDS derived from his musical endeavors go to the Redeemptorist Missions in Brazil and Thailand.

Having the vow of poverty, Father Dustin is not allowed to keep any money for himself and he has no personal possessions of his own including his banjo which belongs to the Redeemptorist Order.

In charge of tickets for his performance at Marian High School is Mrs. Lloyd H. Diehl, Jr.

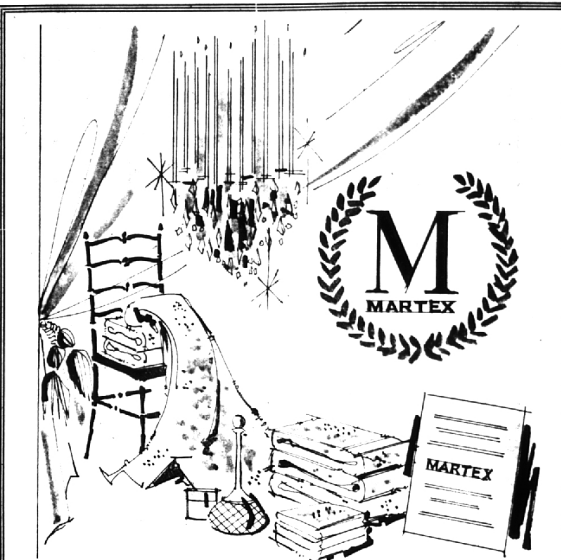
IN AN appeal to presidents and safety chairmen, Fraser asked them to publicize recommendations made by the AAA in recent years as follows:

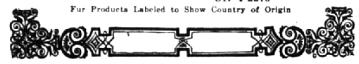

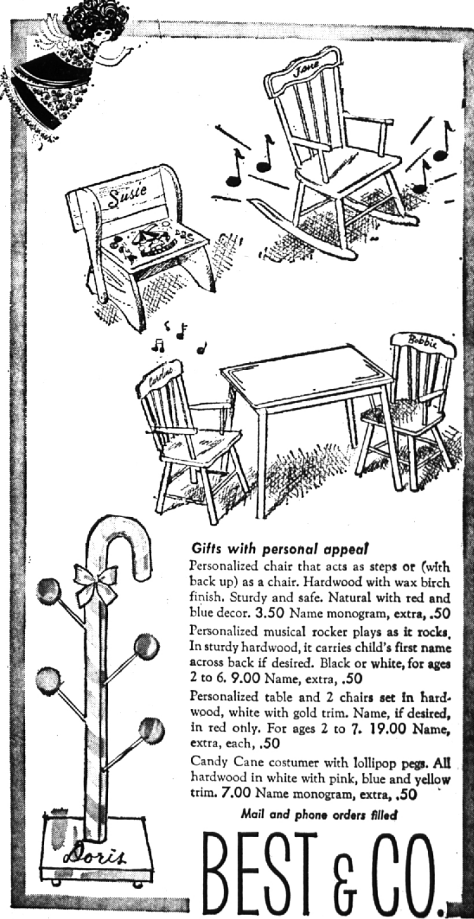
