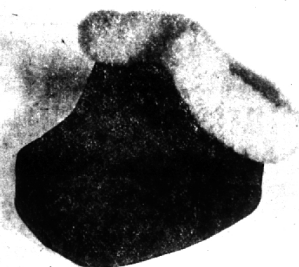
## BROWN SCHOLARSHIP
