

**Volunteers Honored
At William Beaumont**

William Beaumont Hospital will honor volunteers who have passed milestones in their service to the hospital. The awards meeting took place in the Mackinnon Room of the hospital on Tuesday.

Owen R. Pinkerman, hospital director, presented gold pins to those who have given 1,000 hours of volunteer service and silver pins representing 500 hours of service.

Dr. Prescott Jordan Jr., director of surgical training at the hospital, was the guest speaker.

Approximately 800 volunteers serve the hospital in different capacities, and 420,833 hours have been given since the hospital opened. Mrs. Paul E. Chennault Jr., W.S.C. president conducted the meeting and Mrs. Theodore Willis was in charge of program and hospitality for the day.

**U-M Bureau Reports
Increase in Placements**

The Bureau of Appointments and Occupational Information at The University of Michigan assisted 2,062 people in getting teaching positions during 1963-64.

In its busiest year so far, the Bureau placed 404 people in elementary school teaching, 600 in college teaching positions and 1,058 in secondary schools. This marked an increase of 11.6 per cent over the previous year. It also placed 311 school administrators, 25 of which were on a college level.

In the non-education area, the placement service helped 329 persons to find positions in business, industry and government. This number appears relatively low because the U-M has seven additional placement bureaus for specialized areas of study such as engineering, chemistry, law and business administration. These agencies placed a total of 1,001 registrants in jobs.

IN ITS ANNUAL report for the year ending Sept. 30, 1964, the placement service cited the above figures with the observation that there was "a marked upsurge in every phase of placement" during the 1963-64 academic year.

The number of requests from employers around the nation increased to 81,954 from the previous year's total of 76,000. Meanwhile, the number of registrants increased from 4,348 to 4,755, and the number of new placements grew from 2,557 to 2,628.

The report stresses that severe shortage in business and industry still exist, especially in the social sciences, health services, business and industrial administration.

The average salary in almost every area increased over the previous year. The average of teachers increased from \$4,800-\$5,000 to \$5,200 annually. College teaching salaries remained at an average of between \$7,000 and \$7,500.

IN THE GENERAL division, those with a bachelor's degree saw an average salary increase from \$116 a month to \$446, and those with the masters degree, an increase from \$58 to \$597.

In addition to its permanent placement services, the Bureau received over 21,000 requests for summer help. It aided 2,000 students in finding summer jobs in camps, resorts, business, and governments across the nation.
