"Boys with dates usually are better drivers," said Peg Talburt, a point agreed upon by the rest of the group. "It's usually only those boys whose cars are 90 per cent of their lives that like to drive."

THE GROUP also felt that drinking had a lot to do with careless driving habits.

Greg felt that the police were much stricter with teens caught drinking and driving.

"Perhaps they're trying to protect us," said Marilyn Manik. "I don't think teens should drink. It's illegal, so it's all very simple."

"All that the police are doing is stalling the teenagers from drinking," said Jane Talburt.

"This is the point they're trying to make—adults should be able to drink and control themselves," said Marilyn.

THE GROUP agreed that there was much illegal drinking among teens in Birmingham. They said that false identification is quite easy to get or make, and if stores in Birmingham won't sell liquor, then stores in Pontiac will.

"In this community there is a trend to want to grow up fast, and drinking contributes to this end," said Peg.

"Parents in this area also defend drinking among teens," said Marilyn.

"I know of parents who get on the defensive when the police accuse their sons of having the 'big,' said Greg.

"I'm sure there is a strong relationship between teens who drink and parents who drink," said Peg. "And, as teens get older, it becomes easier to get their parents to consent."

ALTHOUGH the youths agreed that it was relatively easy to buy liquor over-the-counter, it is nearly impossible to get served in a restaurant or club.

"Many of the European students are surprised that there are strict drinking laws in America," said Sue Judd. "When I was in Europe last summer, I found that wine or beer is quite common among the teenagers, although they are not served hard liquor."

The teens were divided on whether the drinking age should be lowered to 18. Some felt it would create more problems, while others felt it would take away the "challenge" and therefore become less of a problem.

The teenagers will continue this discussion, and also bring up the private schools' social code, at their Jan. 5 meeting.

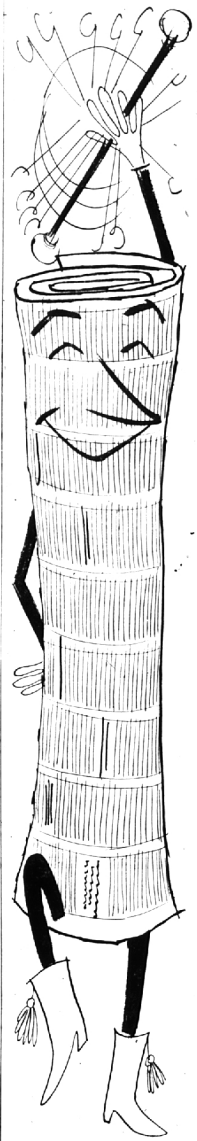
