Four participants from Sacred Heart were among 225 outstanding high school students and science teachers from Southeast Michigan who attended a Junior Science and Humanities Symposium at Wayne State University's McGregor Memorial Conference Center on Friday and Saturday, November 20 and 21.

The participants were Mother Leslie and Mother Kane, Margery Abbink and Mary Pat McGough. The purpose of the two-day conference was to stimulate interest in science and mathematics and to stress the interrelation of science and the humanities.

CO-SPONSORING the symposium were the U.S. Army Research Center, Durham, N. C., U.S. Army Mobility Command, U.S. Army Tank-Automotive Center and WPA. Each session included a major address by a known scientist, a discussion on the importance of humanities in becoming an effective

and well-rounded scientist, a selection of research papers by outstanding students and a special seminar for science teachers participating in the program.

Major addresses were given by Dr. Harold A. Bassilus, director, Wayne State University Press—"Humanities Face the Future," Brigadier General Tobias R. Philip, U.S. Army Material Command—"Science, Technology and Youth," Dr. George W. Beadle, president, University of Chicago and a Nobel Laureate in Medicine—"The Implications and Impact of Current Genetic Research," and Lawson M. McKenzie, research planning associate Ford Motor Co.—"Science Faces the Future."

The national theme of the Junior Science and Humanities symposium program is "Research in Progress—Science in the Making." The specific of the Detroit symposium was "Science Faces the Future."

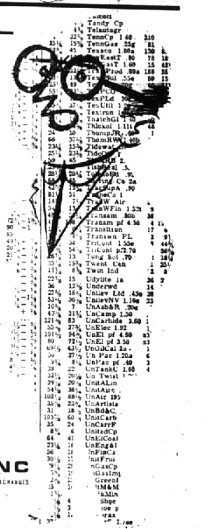

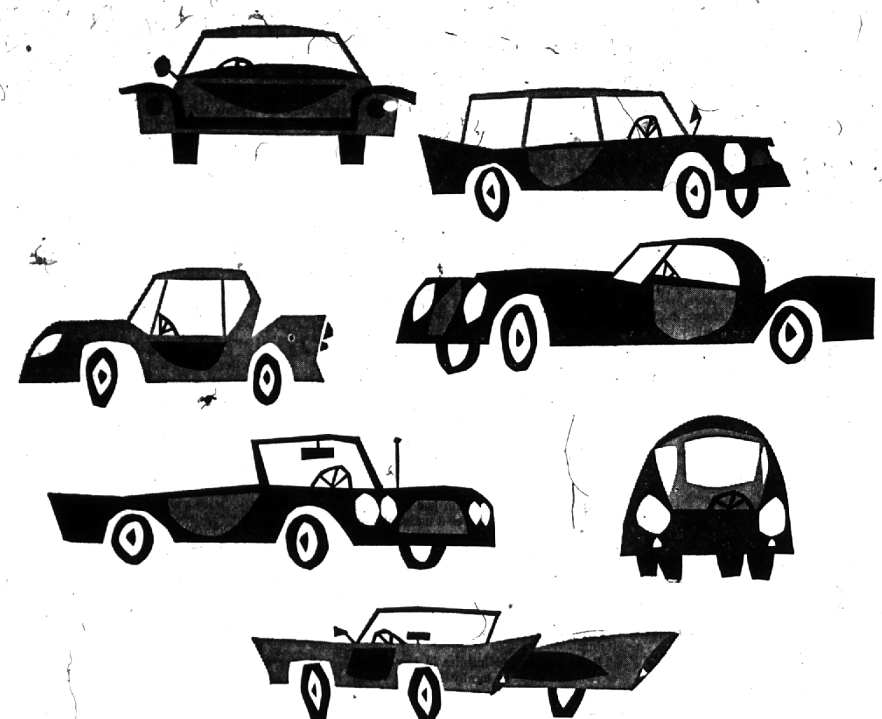
