WSU Theater Offers Special Yule Matinees

The Wayne State University Theatre is presenting three special holiday matinees of "Jack and the Beanstalk" on Saturday afternoons, Dec. 5, 12 and 19 at 2:30 in the Bonstelle Theatre, 3424 Woodward.

This is the production which will tour the greater Detroit area during week ends from January through May.

The Wayne State University Theatre has been touring stage adaptations of children's classics for over 20 years, playing to over 30,000 children annually. Its performances have been sponsored by such organizations as Parent-Teacher Associations, The American Association of University Women, Mothers Clubs and the Girl Scouts.

THE PLAYS ARE selected to encourage the children's appreciation of good literature, as well as to arouse their interest in the theatre. Among the plays which have been toured are "Alice in Wonderland," "Cinderella," "The Elves and the Shoemaker," "The Seven League Boots," "The Emperor's New Clothes," "Hansel and Gretel," "Rumpelstiltskin" and "Aladdin."

This year's production of "Jack and the Beanstalk," designed especially for children, runs only about an hour and a half in length. This fairy tale was last presented by Wayne State University in 1957, when it played for 25 performances in Detroit, Royal Oak, Berkley, Farmington, Grosse Pointe and Birmingham.

THE CAST of this year's production includes Janice Saul, 1731 Richard in Southfield. Direction is by T. O. Andrus.

There are still open dates in the 1965 touring schedule. Interested groups are invited to call the theatre office for information. Tickets for the holiday matinees at the Bonstelle are \$1.00 or 60¢ for groups of ten or more. The Money Picture
