UM Names Freshmen For Honors Council

The highly-select Honors Council of the University of Michigan has admitted 417 entering freshmen to its program of enriched studies.

Comprising 12 per cent of the incoming freshmen class in the College of Literature, Science and the Arts, these honors students were invited to join the program on the basis of high school records, scholastic aptitude and achievement scores, and academic promise.

Otto G. Graf, director of the Honors Council, explains that the program offers several types of unique academic opportunities. Among its features are special counseling, interdepartmental honors courses and honors sections of regular courses, opportunities to participate in research projects of faculty members, faculty-student discussion groups, and directed summer reading for credit.

IN THE JUNIOR and senior years students continuing in or joining the program take special courses in the field of concentration, leading to the honors degree.

The Council was established in 1957. There are now 1,077 undergraduates participating.

Graf points to the program's success as shown by the achievements of the May graduating class. Almost 70 per cent of the 147 Honors graduates attained "honors" or "high honors" for academic achievement and independent work in their fields of concentration.

Over 50 per cent (142) are currently in graduate or professional school, many on one or more of the 126 scholarships and fellowships which were awarded to individuals in support of study here and abroad.

Heart Disease Kills Majority of Residents

How does Birmingham's heart disease problem, including the incidence of strokes among the local population, compare with the situation in other communities?

The question comes to the fore as the government embarks on a new major medical assault on these prime killers, which take 970,000 lives a year between them.

The campaign, to be conducted by the National Institutes of Health, aided by the Veterans Administration, will have, as its first aim, the reduction in the toll from strokes, which now amounts to 200,000 a year.

The size of the problem in Birmingham is indicated by the latest figures from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

They show that 54.8 per cent of all deaths locally, over the course of a year, are due to some form of heart disease.

Throughout the United States as a whole, the proportion is 56.3 per cent and, in the east north central states, 57.0 per cent. The ratio in the State of Michigan is 54.7 per cent.

Some states have a much higher heart rate than others. The range is from a low of 37.8 per cent, found in New Mexico, to a high of 59.9 per cent, in main.


