

Have Trouble With Phones? Blame Storm

A spokesman for Michigan Bell Telephone Co. said today that the delay in getting a dial tone some subscribers experienced before making a call Monday had nothing to do with the change in sound of the tone.

Robert L. Kilpatrick, Birmingham Bell manager, attributed the delay to three factors.

"Holiday calls have already begun, thus increasing the traffic load," he said. "In addition, Monday's bad weather caused an abnormal amount of telephone use."

Kilpatrick said the phone company also has more service calls in bad weather.

"THESE THREE conditions temporarily resulted in more calls than the equipment was designed to handle," he said.

Bell announced last week it would be making an equipment modification in preparation for the Touch-Tone phones that will be introduced in Birmingham next year. The new tone has something of a lower pitch, Kilpatrick said.

"Franklin has lost one of her most devoted citizens, Stan Hunter. Seldom has this community known a man who in a short period of time had a greater impact upon the affairs of the village."

"HE THRIVED on his self-adopted title of the 'old Communist' which perhaps partially explained the enigma that was Stan. He was a demanding taskmaster, not only to everyone he knew, but also to himself. His mental rigor, courage and capacity for hard work were beyond compare."

"He sometimes tried to conceal his gentleness and affection—but was easily exposed on this facet as a monumental impostor by the devotion of all young people who knew him. I had the unusual privilege to know Stan first as a neighbor and later as a public servant. He was a patient teacher and gave generously of his time."

"Franklin extends heartfelt sympathies to his entire family. They can be assured that our little village in the fire is still unknown."
