# Want Gifts That Are 'In'

A sure way to score with the college or high school student on your Christmas list is to present them with a bright red four-on-the-floor sports car, or lacking the ability or inclination to indulge such youthful month-long, take some advice from the American Institute of Men's and Boys' Wear.

In this era of uncertain vertitudes, one can depend on the fact that students sincerely endorse sweaters, outerwear, sport jackets, slacks, rainwear, golf shirts, belts, sport, warm socks and crew socks, gloves, slippers and robes as being really "in."

That is, of course, unless the style of the garment in question is "out." All of this is further confirmed by finding "in" items "out" in different geographical areas or different age groups, while in other instances it can be "out" to be too far "in."

**RECOGNIZING** THE body-trends inherent in that gift-giving situation, the AIBMW has prepared a list of "safe gifts" that should be "in" regardless of age group, area or individual moods.

Among the safest sweaters are camel colors, dark blues and heathery greens in either V-neck pullovers or cardigans. If the student lives in or attends school in a ski area, a bulky, hefty ski-type sweater, patterned or plain, crew or turtleneck is an excellent choice.

Regardless of the area, a turtleneck "tub" to be inserted under a V-neck, a crew-neck or a sport shirt, will show that you are in the know.

**IN YOUR** selection of shirts as student gifts, be restrained. Choose button-down-collared oxfords with a box pleat down the back topped by an unobtrusive, but important, hanger loop. These can be striped or in solid shades of blue, yellow, stone or white.

Going to bed in India Madras slacks are among the universally "in" sport shirts, as are some of the deeper shades of knits. The latter may be devoid of any fancy self-knit decoration and should have plain rib-knit collars.

Outerwear garments offer a significant "in" selection. Big, puffy parka-hooded duffel coats in camel, bold green, deep blue and black are very much admired. So is anything that smacks of the ski slopes. The newest "in" ski parkas are knee-length or a bit longer in the "puff" models, some of which can be worn shorter via snappers.

**THE VAST** majority of the wanted ski parkas are made with nylon "shells" quilted over various fibers to provide warmth without weight. In warmer climates, plain unquilted nylon parkas, hooded and with "kangaroo pockets" score very big.

Those usually have elasticized wrists and the bottoms and are sort of a hybrid sailing-skiing garment, worn by many who have never set foot into either a ski or a boat. By the same token, waist-length poplin golf jackets are very highly regarded by both golfing and non-golfing students.

In gifting your students with neckties, select rep stripes as the universally safe type. However, most college men will want their's in the wider shapes (about 2 1/2 to 2 3/4 inch) and in brighter colors than those worn by the high schoolers, who prefer more restrained colors in the 1 1/2 to 2-inch widths.

**THE YOUNGER** man is apt to think of gloves as an aid to warmth rather than as a fashion accessory. So, unless you have some inside dope on the students on your list, make your selection from the warm-lined leathers such as pig skin, deerskin or capeskin—or go
