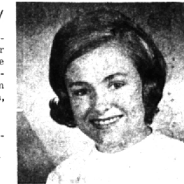
## Host Holiday Party

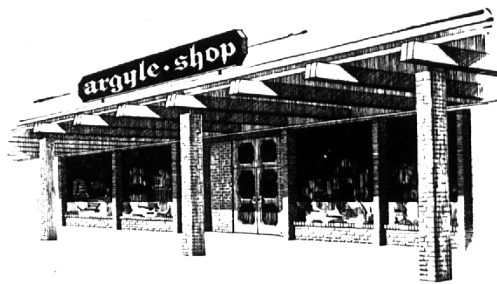

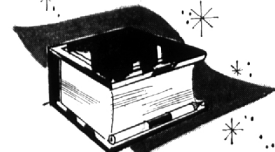

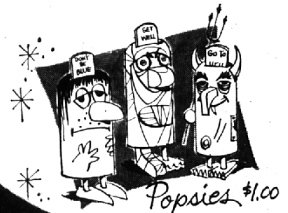
