

Shell Widens Lead At Northwood Lanes

Ray Kourec's high-scoring 1 & 1 Shell rolled into first place three weeks' position round against de-fending champion Northwood Lanes. Shell turned on the power with 1,096 in 2,945 to Northwood's 2,792 for a three-game sweep, increasing its first-place margin to 1 1/2 points.

Leading the Shell attack were Bob Manser with 214, 225 in 636 and Larry Milford with 223, 216 in 615. High for Northwood were Jim Milford Jr. with 216, 223 in 626, Don Bohranski with 226, 189 and John Eisenhart with 214 in 585.

Michigan Machine Rebuilders moved back from a 100-point first game loss to win three points from Reichhold Chemicals, firing 1,008 in 2,857 to Reichhold's 1,004 in 2,768. Hank Hillsbrants in 550 and Kopitzki provided much of Reichhold's fire-power with 254 in 619 and 216 in 594, respectively. Pacing the machine men were Wiley Wendell with 226, 210 in 603 and Dale Parson with 203, 213 in 595.

TORRENCE OIL replaced fifth-place Birmingham Drags in the standings by overwhelming the druggists, 2,862 to 2,626. Pacing the high-flying oilers were Joe Kiley with 205, 204 in 646, Jack Pourcave with 221 in 593 and Tiger Al Santelle with 229.

Dave Cashman "pulled out" a series and pulled a three-point triumph for Redford Bowling Sales by rolling a 248 third game for a 616 series as Redford out-totaled Vincent Five. Top man for Vincent was George Williams with 212, 221 in 614.

John Schütz Place Reactors moved into a ninth-place tie with Conklin-Palmer Insurance by winning three from Conklin. Mike Barber led the reactors with 203, 208, 202 for 608 and Claude Adair added 210, 235 in 597.

Cranbrook, a team that had 55 rebounds and shot 48 per cent from the floor, will face Culver Academy Saturday at home.

In the Seaborn-Port Huron game Friday, the Maples didn't have nearly as rough a time. They built up a 19-0 first quarter advantage, opened it to 30-19 at half and coasted through the last two periods to win, 74-55.

Parry used 10 ball players and nine figured in the scoring, with Horner and Tom Snyder each netting 17 to lead the club. Wilbur had 13 and Toland added 12.

The Maples shot a hot 52 per cent from the floor in the opening half, while Horner was a big help on the boards in the opening stages.

Grouse Hunters Get 2nd Chance in State

Aside from temperatures that may numb trigger fingers, prospects look good for grouse hunters during this year's season, which has been extended through December in southern Michigan below Highway M-30.

Unless there is deep snow to slow action during the next few weeks of the longest grouse season held anywhere in Michigan since the late 1900 hunting conditions should be generally better than they were in late October.

Compared with early stages of the season, the weather will be cooler and ground cover quicker—two plus factors for best hunting by men and their dogs.

ON TOP of this, hunter reports covering the early fall period indicate that the southern grouse supply is at least as high as it was last year when more than 80,000 birds were taken during the region's shorter season.
