



### Area Missilemen On Guard for Christmas Vigil

While Birmingham residents get ready for the Christmas holidays, forces of the Michigan Army National Guard who are manning Nike missile sites will continue to keep a vigil which cannot be relaxed at any time.

Many of the men who maintain a continuous 24-hour alert to repel any attack from the air over this area must forego the traditional religious holiday to remain close to their weapons.

These troops, whose mission keeps them in a state of constant readiness every day of the year, belong to the guided missile units under the operational control of the United States Army Air Defense Command.

THE NIKE SITE in this area is the Utica Nike Site manned by Battery A, 1st missile battalion (Nike-Hercules), 17th Artillery, commanded by Capt. William P. Shelton of Detroit.

The chaplain for this unit is Capt. Carl R. Sayers, who is also rector of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Birmingham. Warrant Officer Richard G. Tate Jr., a former resident, is fire control technician for the same unit.

### B'ham Psychiatrist Gives Talk on Drug Addiction in N. Y.

Four members of the Wayne State University medical faculty spoke at the American Psychosomatic Association's recent annual meeting at the Commodore Hotel, New York City.

Clinical professor Peter A. Martin of Detroit, talked on "A Psychosomatic Study of the Marchal-Lévy Theme from Der Rosenkavalier," and Dr. Richard F. Storer, also a clinical professor, of Strosbe, discussed "Remarks on Joseph Conrad's Heart of Darkness."

A joint presentation on "The Anhedonic Aspects of the Addictions—Part I: Ecstasy, Pain Tolerance and Drug Studies," was given by Dr. Henry Krystal of Detroit, and Dr. Herbert A. Raskin, 4660 Pickering, Birmingham, clinical assistant and clinical associate professors, respectively.

The speakers are all members of the School of Medicine's psychiatry department.

### Insurances Show Growth During Past 10 Years

Heath insurance protects 48 million more Americans today than it did 10 years ago, the Health Insurance Institute said today.

Ten years ago, over 97 million Americans were covered by hospital expense insurance. Since then there has been a coverage increase of nearly one-and-one-half times, and a total of over 145 million persons were protected against the cost of hospital care at year-end 1963, declared the Institute.

In 1953, 61 per cent of the U.S. civilian population was protected by some form of health insurance, the Institute said, while at the beginning of this year 77 per cent was so insured.

THE SAME TYPE of growth has been shown, said the Institute, by other forms of health insurance.

In 1953, nearly 81 million Americans had surgical expense insurance, but in the following 10 years there was a 67 per cent increase in this coverage and at the end of 1963 nearly 135 million persons had protection against the cost of surgical bills.
