Let Contracts For Work on Hills Schools

Contracts for the second package of additions in the Bloomfield Hills School District have been awarded by the board of education.

Bandy Construction Co. of Pontiac, with a low bid of \$408,450, will be the general contractor for the work at East Hills Junior High and Booth and Pine Lake elementary schools.

For mechanical work, the lowest of five bidders was W. J. Revoldt of Southfield, at \$139,750.

The third contract was awarded to Electrical Maintenance Service of Orchard Lake at a bid of \$59,900, and Farnell Co. of Detroit will supply new school equipment at a cost of \$8,213.

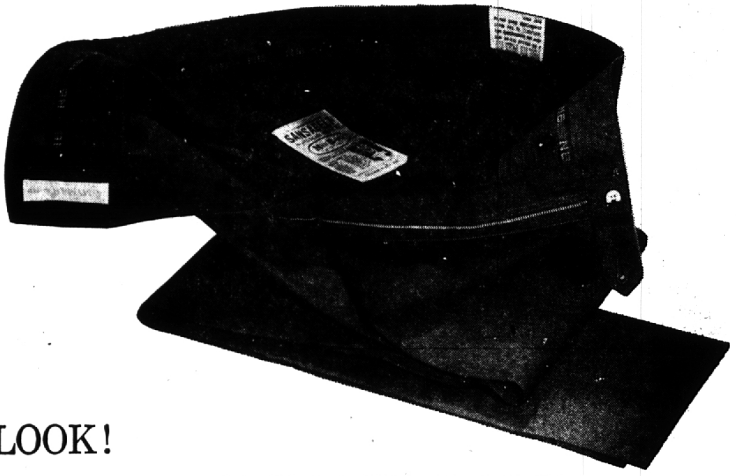
ALTERNATES totaling \$10,051

The work is scheduled for completion by the time school opens next September.

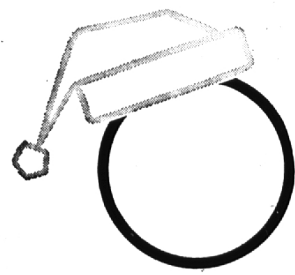
