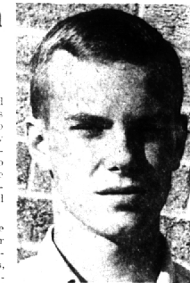
The two students will represent Michigan in the William Randolph Hearst Foundation Senate Youth Program.

The extremely tight agenda will include a visit at the White House where it is hoped President Lyndon B. Johnson will address the students.
