**Chamber Chief Speaks Before Alma Students**

Walter F. Carey, 6125 Middlebelt, West Bloomfield Township, president of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States and president of Automobile Carriers' Dealers Transit of Birmingham, will address the Alma College student body at a 10-00 a.m. convocation today.

The title of his talk will be "Pillars of Society." Carey, head of a \$20 million-a-year trucking complex, is the 37th president of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States.

Carey, trustee and treasurer of Alma College, believes that American businessmen should stand up and speak out for the profit system and what it has done for America. He sees the Chamber presidency as a post from which he can "help business create a better image of what it is and how vital it is to our way of life."

CAREY ENTERED the trucking business in 1929. Starting with two mortgaged-to-the-hilt tractor-trailer units, he and some associates built the Motor Car Transport Co., automobile transporters, into a successful enterprise.

In 1934, Carey helped to organize Commercial Carriers, Inc. and became president of the company. Under his administration, which continued until 1950, the firm became the largest transporter of new automobiles in the country.

During this same period, he and his partner, Bert Beveridge, organized Commercial Barge Lines, Inc., which transported automobiles and general freight via the Inland Waterway System.

FOR MANY years Carey has his services available to the government. During World War II he represented the trucking industry on a board advising the U. S. Army Transportation Corps. He serves as a member of Secretary of Defense McNamara's Defense Industry Advisory Council, and recently directed a study aimed at improving military shipping practices.

Carey has been a member of the National Chamber's Board of Directors since May, 1955. He became president, April 29, 1964.

Other organizations in which he has held office include the Greater Detroit Board of Commerce, the Economic Club of Detroit, the Transportation Association of America, the Michigan Aeronautics and Space Association, the National Safety Council and its Public Safety Committee.

He has served his community as a member of the National Budget Committee of the United Defense Fund and the Detroit-Tomorrow Committee; president of the Wayne State University Alumni Association; and president of the Kirk-in-the-Hills Presbyterian Church Trustees.

**Profs Author Teaching Aid**

A new "individualized" sequence approach to the teaching of composition in grade school and junior high has been authored by two Wayne State University professors and is being published by Science Research Associates of Chicago.

General series author of the "Writing Skills Laboratory," an instructional aid, is William E. Hoth, chairman, English education department. Dr. Hoth, Dearborn, said the series develops a sequence in writing skills, allowing children to learn at their individual pace.

CO-AUTHORS of the 7th and 8th grade program are Floyd L. Bergman, 2407 Dorchester, Birmingham, instructor in the English education department at WSU and Ray Budde, director of instructional service, East Lansing Public Schools.

The instructional material for grades 5-8 is only the first work in a total series planned for the entire school range, including the 12th grade.
