

St. Stephen's Sets Holiday Services

Christmas services at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church will begin tonight with a Christmas Eve Holy Communion service, featuring the furnishing of the crèche by children of the church school.

Special music will be provided by a soloist, pianist and recorder artist. Prof. James Hadon, dean of philosophy at Oakland University. The recorder will correspond to the shepherd's pipe. The confessions will be heard from 5-6 p.m.

A midnight Eucharist will be held at 11:30 tonight with music by St. Stephen's adult choir. On Christmas Day, a Holy Communion service will be held at 10 a.m.

ON SATURDAY, St. Stephen's Day, communion will be held at 10 a.m. and a Holy Communion will take place at 8 a.m.

At 10 a.m. Sunday, the traditional post-Christmas service will be held, featuring the nine lessons and carols. The service was organized at King's College in Cambridge, England.

High school and college students, together with young people home from the armed forces on leave, will read the lessons.
