Good Education Called Key to Nat'l Survival

Education is now the key not only to individual success and economic growth, but probably also to national survival, according to Prof. Norman Harris of The University of Michigan Center for the Study of Higher Education.

"For the most part," says Harris, "our concept of higher education has been a traditional one. Even here in America, in a society which is non-tradition-directed, we have been content to allow most of our colleges and universities to reflect the cultural patterns and voice the educational cliches of the Greco-Roman-European tradition."

Harris says it is unfortunate we still find ready acceptance for the idea that higher education is largely for the financially able. Also we believe too readily that a college is a community of scholars, for the intellectually gifted, and that it should concern itself with the humanities.

"All of these ideas are true," says Harris, "but college should also concern itself with the practical arts, and with the great needs of today's civilization.

"Change, not tradition, is the hall-mark of American society today," says the U.M. educator. "Tradition-directed higher education makes no more sense for the 20th century than would the Greeks' concept of citizenship restricted to the select few, or the Middle Ages' doctrine of the divine right of kings, or Dalton's concept of the indivisible little round atom.

"Higher education for most youth today," says Harris, "must be characterized by diversity rather than conformity; by opportunity rather than selectivity; and by practicality rather than by sheer intellectuality.

"Someone has said that the goal of a liberal education is the unity of the good, the true and the beautiful. For the 'good' one thinks of the humanities; for the 'true' the sciences; and for the 'beautiful,' the arts.

"To these," says Harris in conclusion, "I would add the 'necessary'—occupational education for the world of work. The community junior college is taking a major role in this 'necessary' segment of a liberal education."

Broomfield Names Candidates for Military Schools

Nominees for seven openings at West Point, Annapolis and the Air Force Academy have been announced by Congressman William S. Broomfield (R - Oakland County).

The youths were the high scorers of 86 who took a Civil Service examination last July and October. From the nominees, we will go to the Air Academy, two to the Military Academy and three to the Naval Academy.

Those who will enter next July must first pass an Academy entrance test and a final physical examination. After successfully completing four years of study, they will graduate as officers in their respective service.

THE TWO candidates out of 12 who score highest in the Air Academy examination next spring will become Air Cadets at the academy in Colorado Springs.

Principal candidates and alternates to West Point and Annapolis were selected strictly on the basis of their scores on the civil service examinations," said Broomfield. He said nominations were made from the 18th District, which includes all Oakland County.
