After a brief let-up during the summer months, activity on the governmental level moved into high gear.

B'ham Keeps Parking on Harmon St.

Parking will remain on Birmingham's Harmon Street.

City commissioners, reviewing a report by Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley, decided to make no change in the present regulations.

On Nov. 23 R. H. Butler petitioned the commission to prohibit parking on the north side of Harmon from Woodland east to 372 Harmon. He also requested that one-hour restrictions be placed on the south side of Harmon from Woodward to Woodland.

Butler was supported in his request by 11 residents in the area.

ALTHOUGH A minor problem does exist, Moxley said, a survey showed the parked cars do not cause a "serious obstacle" to moving traffic.

Parking restrictions, Moxley said, would force all-day parkers to move either deeper into the residential area or to Municipal Lot No. 6 which is already filled to capacity.

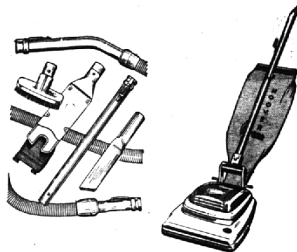
