states didn't, and there have been other examples that have been less striking.

The thing about the Republican philosophy is that it refuses to cease its dedication to those great human qualities that have made us what we are today. And if they will dedicate themselves to emulating this particular class of pioneers that we so much admire, then I think not only are we assured of victory, over and over again, but I believe that the United States will go on down to its appointed destiny proudly—a nation of free men, standing up by their chins up, backs straight, and we'll never have to bow our neck to Washington and say "Please, give us."

Under appropriate Party officials these could be conducted in every state and every county—indeed, in every precinct, in every block, in every rural area.

At the same time I think we would need to open at Party headquarters in Washington what could perhaps be called a "Suggestion Center for a Better America." To this center every citizen would be invited to contribute his views on the most pressing issues of the day.

It would be most important that the early results of these efforts be assembled in time to reach our 1964 Platform Committee well in advance of the Convention, so they could be directly reflected in a Republican Peoples' Platform. Thereafter, the entire system should continue to operate at full speed, right down to election day.

BY VIGOROUSLY promoting such a program, I believe we Republicans can develop an expression of the mainstream thinking of an informed people. We will know their real concerns. country was at war, was 851,928 to 638,876.

In studying county government in Michigan prior to the calling of the Constitutional Convention, the League of Women Voters reached the conclusion that home rule for counties could be accomplished only by constitutional revision.

IN TESTIMONY before the Constitutional Convention the league position was clearly stated: "The present strict definition of county government in the constitution creates problems. The league finds that there is no clear cut line of accountability and responsibility in county government; that the basis of representation on the county governing boards is unsatisfactory; that many county governing boards become too large; and there are too many elective officials. The league believes that the

amendment, like its predecessors, failed to secure ratification. The vote was close, however, 455,220 to 432,164.

IN 1944, THE people of Wayne County submitted an initiative proposal, which again applied only to Wayne County and made few significant changes in the amendment which had preceded it in defeat. This time the vote, cast when the
