Lathrup Hears Of First Plans For New Homes

Lathrup Village's City Council received initial word at their Monday night meeting of a proposed two-block housing development on Middlesex Avenue from Santa Barbara to Moundbrook N.W.

A letter from the Guy Antonelli Contractors requesting permission to install a sewer system was the first notification that plans were being formulated to continue building this spring in the subdivision.

OTHER ACTION at the meeting included passage of the downspout ordinance which had been under consideration for several months.

The ordinance forbids draining of roof and land waste into sanitary sewers, but retains the permits given some residents under earlier ordinances.

First readings of the sewage disposal charge and water rate ordinances were given discussion by the council and tabled for a revision of the wording.

The sewage disposal charge ordinance proposes a minimum charge of 82 cents per 1000 feet of water, the maximum charge being \$8.20. The charge would be tabulated by readings on the water meter.

MAYOR RICHARD COGGER officially proclaimed Feb. 7-13 as Boy Scout Week in Lathrup Village. Eagle Scout Doug Lundberg, from Troop 1343, received the proclamation on behalf of the Scouts.

City Manager Jerald Stone, representing Lathrup Village on the Beautification Council of Southeastern Michigan, gave a report on the Council's initial meeting held in Dearborn recently.

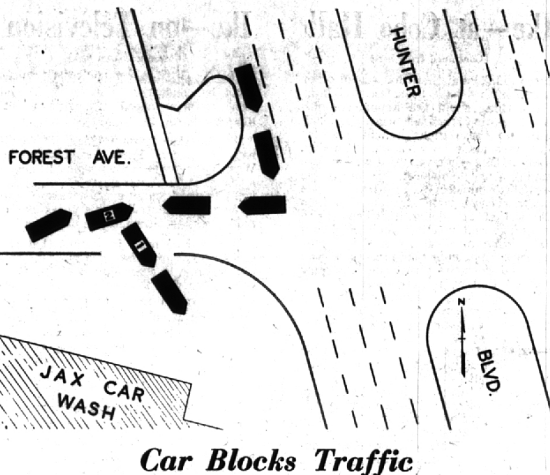
Stone was elected treasurer of the group which was formed by communities interested in the upkeep of their towns.

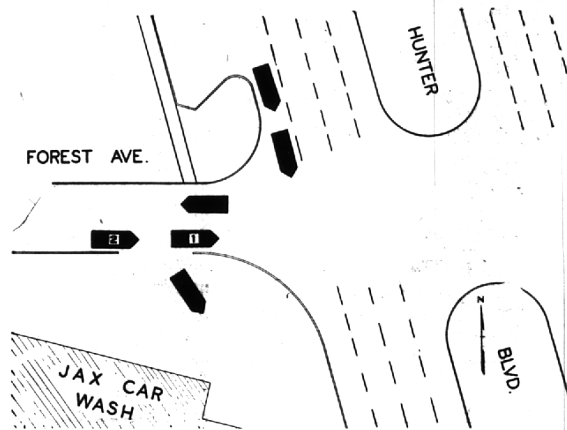

Car Blocks Traffic

In the top diagram, eastbound Forest vehicle (Car 1) is attempting to turn into the car wash and does not have room to clear the eastbound lane. This, in turn, forces other eastbound traffic (Car 2) to block westbound Forest traffic, which halts cars on southbound Hunter. When there is not enough room to pull into the car wash driveway, motorists should drive around the block until traffic has cleared, as shown in the second diagram.

'Best of State' Product Drive Now In Progress

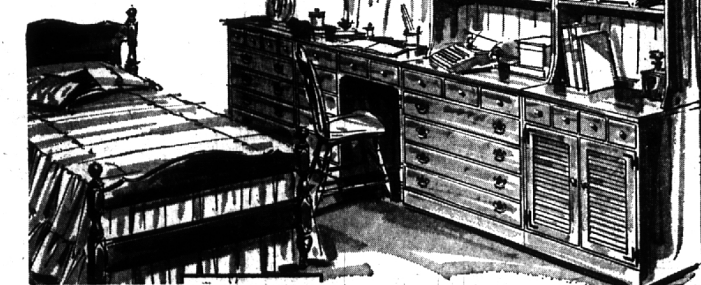
