meaning "as you please." It was the term used by schoolmen of the middle ages to designate the subtle questions in caustic in which they delighted to exercise their dialectical skills.



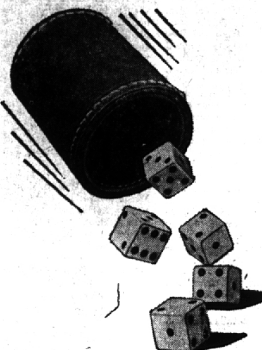

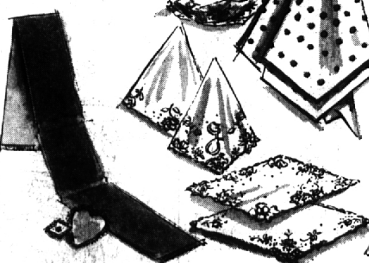

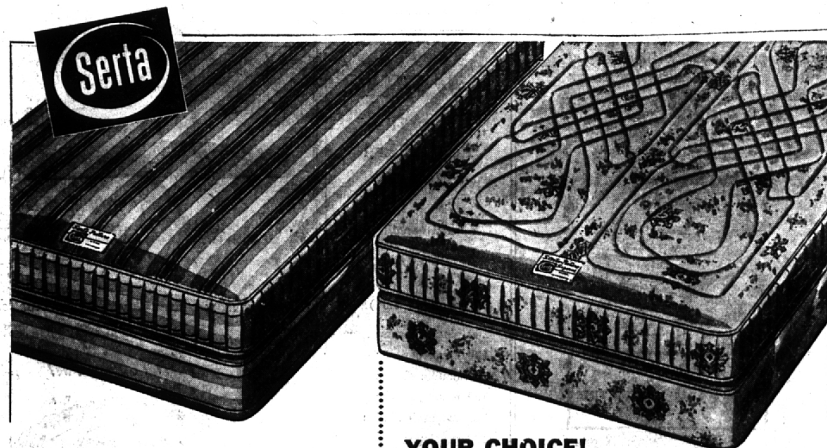
