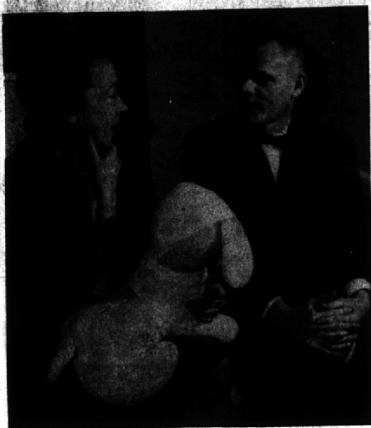

From this meeting emerged the organization known as F.A.R.—Friends and Relatives of Retarded Children of Oakland County, Inc.

As a result of that first meeting, a pioneer, parent-sponsored program was initiated for nursery

level children and later extended to include older children and young adults. Today, a thriving Training Center is maintained in the Ferndale Community Building, 400 E. Nine Mile Road, Ferndale, with a branch in Birmingham, where these retardates may participate in educational, social and recreational activities.

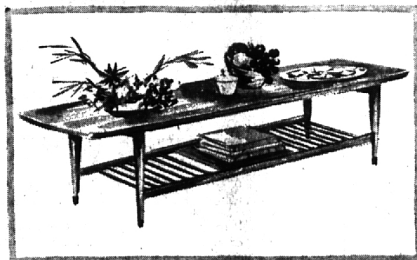

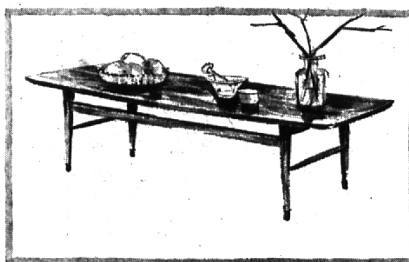
