## NOTICE OF REGULAR VILLAGE ELECTION VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN, MICHIGAN March 9, 1964

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN, COUNTY OF OAKLAND, STATE OF MICHIGAN:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT A Regular Village Election will be held in the Village of Franklin, in the County of Oakland and the State of Michigan on the 9th day of March 1964, from 7:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, Eastern Standard Time, for the purpose of electing candidates for the following offices:

and to vote on the following propositions, to-wit:

A. Charter Amendment — Shall Chapter II, Section 2, Sub-section (1) of the Charter of the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan, be amended so as to give the Village power:

(1) to acquire by purchase, gift or lease, personal property of a value not to exceed \$5,000.00 for any public use or purpose within the scope of its powers and to hold, manage, control, sell or otherwise dispose of the same without approval of the electorate?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the full text of the proposed Charter Amendment is as follows:

### CHAPTER II POWERS IN GENERAL

Section 2. The Village shall have the power:

(1) To acquire by purchase, gift or lease, personal property of a value not to exceed \$5,000.00 for any public use or purpose within the scope of its powers and to hold, manage, control, sell or otherwise dispose of the same without approval of the electorate;

B. Charter Amendment — Shall Chapter IX of the Charter of the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan, be amended so as to permit the Village Council to borrow money and issue general obligation bonds of the village to finance the improvement of streets in the village upon the approval by a 3/5's vote of the electors of the village voting upon the question in an annual or special village election to be held during the year 1964?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the full text of the proposed Charter Amendment is as follows:

### CHAPTER IX GENERAL FINANCE, VILLAGE BUDGET AND FUNDS

Section 12. The Council, subject to the applicable provisions of law, may borrow money and issue general obligation bonds of the village to finance the improvement of streets in the village with the approval by a 3/5's vote of the electors of the village voting upon the question at an annual or special village election held during the year 1964.

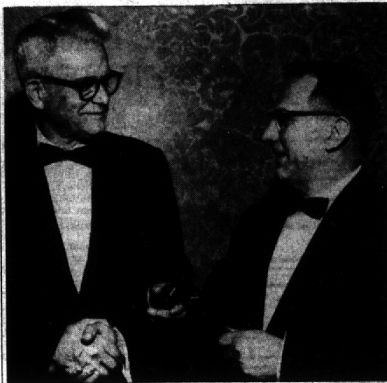
C. Bond Proposition — "Shall the Village of Franklin, Oakland County Michigan, borrow the sum of Two Hundred Thirty Thousand and 00/100 (\$230,000) Dollars and issue its bonds, therefore, for the purpose of defraying a part of the cost of improving the streets in the village?"

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that only those qualified electors of the Village of Franklin who have property assessed for taxation in said village, or the lawful husbands or wives of such persons, shall be eligible to vote on said bond proposition.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the polling place for said Regular Village Election will be at the Franklin School, 32220 Franklin Road in said village.

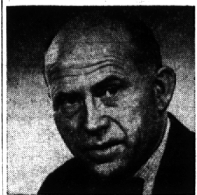
## Publisher to Talk On Mental Health

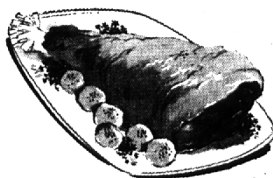
