

Country Day Hands GPUS 53-46 Defeat

Detroit Country Day snapped a seven-game losing streak and scored its first athletic win over Grose Point University School in four years Friday with a 53-46 triumph.

Elated coach John Hannett said that the team "hustled themselves silly. We got ahead and pressed them."

Country Day was led by Mike Dunn's 15 points, but a key factor in the win was Steve Serlin's defensive work on GPUS's George Perrin, who managed only 15 points.

COUNTRY DAY shot 45 per cent from the floor, an average far above what the Yellowjackets have hit in previous contests. Dave Walker added 12 points and Paul Sonda nine for the winners.

Country Day trailed after one period, 14-13, and at the half, 29-27, but outscored their opponents 36-17 in the second half to win.

Grose Point had defeated Country Day earlier this year, 56-45. The Yellowjackets face Maumee Valley Friday.
