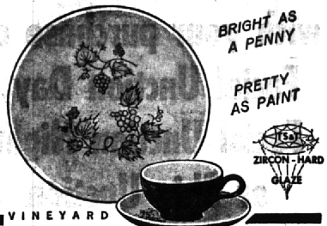


To Be Bride

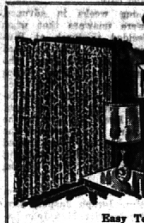

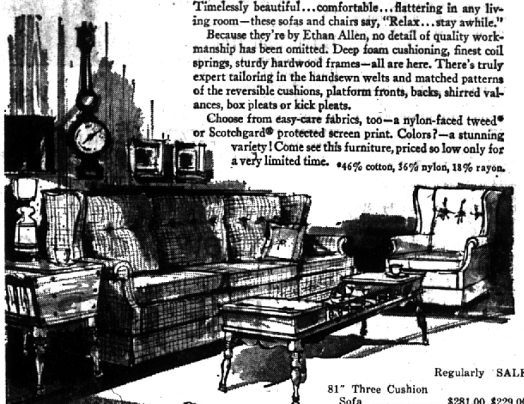

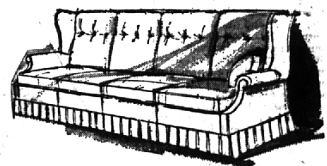
