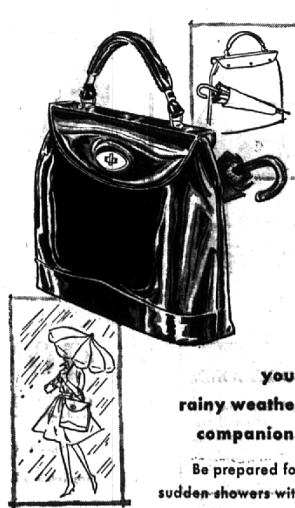
## Wedding Bells

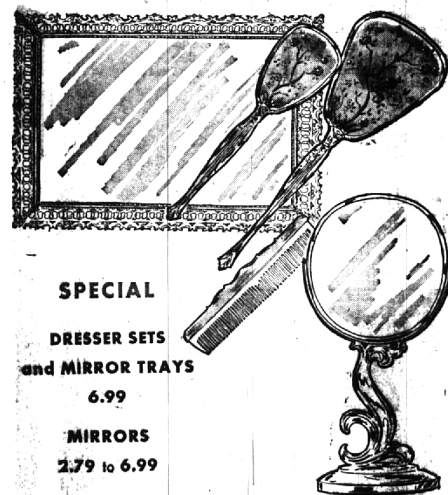

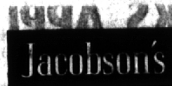
