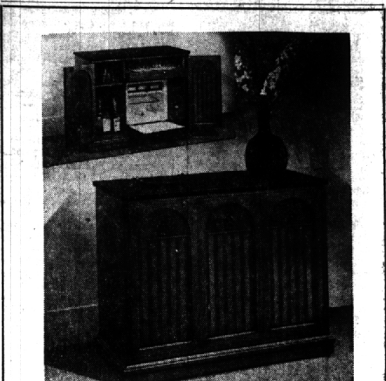


June Bride
