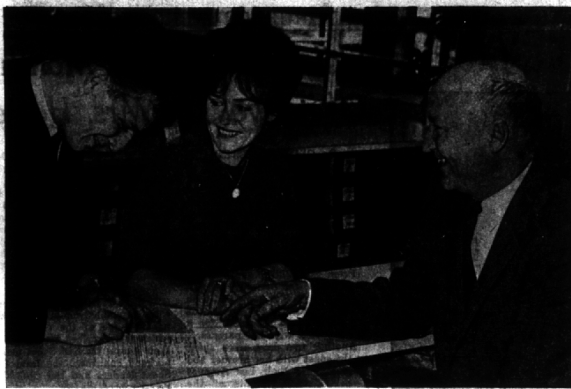
The Lindermes, after a month of motel living, moved Saturday into an apartment in the Cranbrook Manor Apartments until they can once again move into their repaired home.
