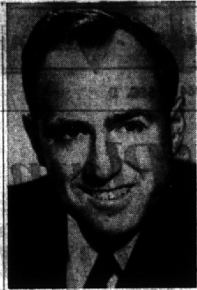

# General Paints Way To Kenilworth Show

Titled everything from "Detroit in Smog" to "Stories in Backyard" are original water colors of General S. L. A. Marshall, being exhibited through Saturday at the Kenilworth Art Gallery, 165 Pierce, Birmingham.

Gen. Marshall, a Birmingham resident at 897 Westchester Way, previously has been known as a historian, military critic, commentator and writer.

According to Gen. Marshall, the story of the painting goes like this:

"TWO YEARS AGO the past Christmas season, while in New York, I bought sets of oils, easels and palettes for our three daughters, Sharon, Cate and Bridget.

"When I returned home, my wife Cate said: 'Fine, now what do we do with them? No one in this house knows how to paint.'

"I commented that when I was in the eighth grade I thought I knew something about it. So I started in, for the purpose of trying my own hand, before I began to instruct the daughters.

"But I began with water colors, which seemed simpler; the first requisite, it seemed to me, was to

decide I could play with colors for 30 minutes or so and feel refreshed.

"In consequence, it became less a hobby than a form of therapy. In the two years I did 56 things—landscapes, seascapes, birds, native dances, etc.

"But as to landscapes, I prefer to do them with live figures in them. For materials up till now, I have paid out approximately \$7.

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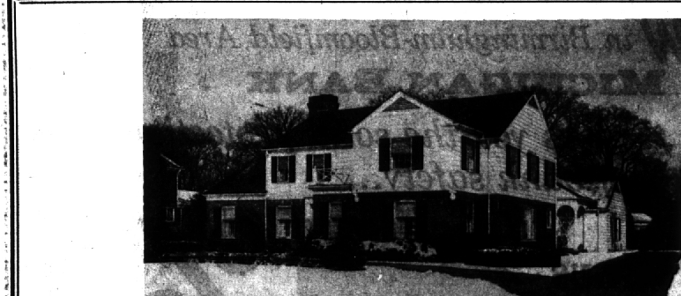
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
