But for two missed spares in the last two frames of the third game, Bob Hoerstrom would have rolled his first 700 series of the season. The chunky Birmingham Drug anchorman led individual scoring last week in the Northwood Lanes Senior House with games of 224, 226, 233 for a 683 series.

Hoerstrom's fine shooting plus Larry Brown's 241, 200 in 629 and Don Docter's 202, 211 in 584 ended Birmingham Drug to sweep four points from H. R. Black, Co. and take over first place in the closely fought league race. Young Ron Barbosa shot 233 in 606 to pace Black to a 2700 series against Drug's 1058 in 2925.

The closeness of the league race has, to some extent, been caused by the Dealer's Pizzeria team. During the last four weeks Donnie has met and defeated the first four teams in the standings. The latest "big" team to meet defeat was Conklin-Palmer Insurance. Led by Bill Williamson's 247, 228 in 680, Donnie's 1914 in 2843 was too much for Conklin. Conklin's top shooters were Bill Anderson with 207 in 695 and Howard McCaslin with 254.

MICHIGAN MACHINE stopped the Reichold Chemis express 2847-2724. Individual leaders in this match were Jon Sevald with 245, 203 in 647, Vern Wendell with 223 in 597, and Bob Costew with 227 in 589.

Pierce Realtors proved that persistence pays off. After shooting games of 990 and 920 and losing both, Pierce uncocked 1036 to win the third game and total pins from Northwood Lanes' 1020 in 2816. Steve "Spider" Yeaman paced Pierce with 238, 203 in 619, followed by Claude Adair's 236, 201 in 601, and Bill Cox' 221 in 583. Steve's honor in the match, however, went to Northwood's Jim Milford Jr. who rolled 247, 200, 202 for 649 to aid Bill Brown's 233, 204 in 592.

Tri-Vending out-rolled L & L Shell, 2949 to 2901, in a match which saw individual scoring honors taken by L & L's Doug Swends, who posted 233, 211 in 612 and Ray Kource with 226 in 594.

The evening's final contest was an example of the league's fine balance. Torrence Oil won the first two games from Birmingham Bowl 961 to 949, and 964 to 918; Bowl upended Torrence in the third game 990 to 881 to win total points by one pin, 2857-2856.




