Woodward, which is one of the city's most troublesome corners.

THE ADMINISTRATION was instructed to conduct further studies of the intersection to try to find a solution to the problem of motorists in the right-hand lane who do not turn right off Woodward onto Lincoln as required.

The curb radii will also be enlarged at the Woodward-Oak intersection and the sidewalk will be moved further from the curb.

Commissioners postponed taking action on the Hunter-Oakland intersection until after the Central Business District Development Plan is further along.

Fire Causes \$6,500 Loss In Beverly

BEVERLY HILLS — A fire, fanned by 80-mile-an-hour winds, caused \$6,500 in damages to a home at 18308 Kirkshire last Thursday morning.

The blaze, which firemen say started in a utility room fuse box, also swept through the kitchen, bathroom, a bedroom and a finished upstairs portion of the house, owned by John R. Welch.

Mrs. Welch, who was in the kitchen, was notified by one of her small children that "the cubby hole is on fire." She saw the wall burning around the fuse box and warned the three other children.

THE FAMILY ran out of the house to a neighbor's and telephoned the Beverly Hills Fire Dept. Firemen, hampered by the high winds, fought the blaze for 2 1/2 hours.

Materials recommended are: SCALECIDE for needle trees, ornamental & edible fruits, berried ornamentals, evergreens, lilac, etonumy scale, etc. LIME-SULFUR for peach leaf curl, maple leaf gall, roses, pear, quince, etc. REMEMBER THAT SULPHUR STAINS PAINTED SURFACES.
2. EQUIPMENT CONDITIONING—If you have not done it or cannot do it, call MI 4-4183 and WE WILL PICK THEM UP & DELIVER THEM TO YOU IN GOOD CONDITION & NO DELIVERY CHARGE.

3. LAWN FERTILIZER—This is an ideal time to make the first application. Suggested materials: AGRICO GRASS FOOD 16-8-8 AGRICO FOR TURF 10-6-4 GREENFIELD LAWN FOOD 20-10-5 REGAL ORGANIC 5-4-0 STADLERS XXX 10-6-4
4. SEE No. 2. You can't be accurate with a beaten up, dirty, sticky spreader.
5. PRUNING—Simple amateur rules enable you to do a great deal at no cost—leaving less work for the professional.

REMOVE DEADWOOD
REMOVE DISEASED WOOD
REMOVE ONE OF TWO RUBBING BRANCHES
REMOVE WEAK STEMS
TRIM BACK STRAGGLERS
REMOVE SOME OF CROWDED STEMS
COAT ALL NEW CUTS WITH TREE PAINT. DO NOT PRUNE SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS UNTIL THROUGH BLOOMING.

6. Part of a small can of TERSAN—This means you must pay attention NOW to SNOW MOLD.
- If you are SURE that the dead looking areas in your lawn were NOT THERE last fall it is possible they were caused by SNOW MOLD. They should be sprayed with TERSAN the FIRST TIME the ground is free of snow.
7. See No. 2 (Equipment Conditioning).
8. BIRD FEEDERS are to attract and keep birds in YOUR YARD. Of course, they eat the feed you provide but they also are magnificent cleaners of insects, eggs & larvae from your trees. Stop feeding and your neighbor will hire them.
9. Not a bad time to spread remnants of fertilizers in particular areas (as well as newly purchased materials) for an early spring feeding.

state highways and some major county roads. The state police and county sheriff's office should be doing this," he said.

Case asked if the fire department also needs eight more men. "At one station we only have one fireman on each shift," Case said.

REEVE'S questioning came as board members examined police reports for the month of February.

The report showed mileage of police cars was up 4,000 miles over a year ago. Calls received by the police increased from 592 in February, 1963, to 810 in 1964.

Simple and grand larceny jumped from 17 to 30 cases. Fights and troubles with drunks increased from 2 to 12, breaking and entering from 2 to 4.

Police issued twice the number of traffic tickets. There were 112 issued in 1963, 251 this year.
