BRIDGE in BIRMINGHAM

It is usual for all units to give a committee party, just prior to a sectional tournament, for those members of the unit who will assist in the event.

Southern Michigan Bridge Association gave such a party recently, and many from the Birmingham area were invited and attended. The session is at Mt. Clemens, March 19 through 22.

Our hand for today is taken from the tournament played at this committee party, and Dottie Barron of this area played this hand and did receive the top board.

It was very daring to arrive at the contract but was played to perfection.

The bidding:

Opening lead: K♣

Dottie won the opening lead of the king of diamonds in the dummy, and discarded her other diamond on the ace of spades. Next, she played a low trump from dummy and won with the king. At this point, Dottie took time out to study the hand.

If the clubs are four and two then she cannot miss the contract; if the clubs are five and one and the second trump is with the singleton club, then the contract is impossible to make; but if the singleton club is with the singleton heart's then, too, this contract can be made.

Therefore Dottie now played the king of clubs and followed it with the ace. This way, she was able to trump out her remaining clubs and make this contract. May add that my opponents were also in seven hearts and didn't do as well as Dottie.

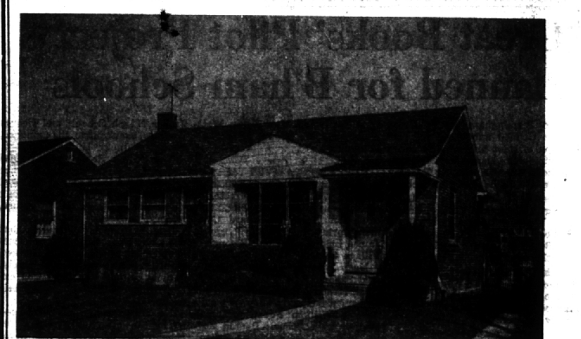
