(e) Every lot on which a multiple dwelling structure is erected shall be provided with a 20 foot side yard on each side of such lot. Each side yard shall be increased by one (1) foot for each ten (10) feet or part thereof by which the length of the multiple dwelling structure exceeds forty (40) feet in over-all dimension, along the adjoining lot line. In order to preserve the general open character of the district, structures shall be limited in length to one hundred twenty-five (125) feet. Rear yards and spacing between buildings shall be provided on the following basis:

1 and 2 story structures—45 feet between buildings and 35 foot rear yards.

A six (6) foot overbearing masonry wall shall be provided along the exterior lot line of the multiple-family residential district wherever the parking space is so laid out as to abutle one-family residential districts. The Board of Appeals may modify the height requirement, where due to unusual circumstances, no good purpose would be served by compliance with the requirement of a six (6) foot wall. In modifying the height requirements the Board of Appeals may set further requirements or conditions for the protection of the residential district abutting such multiple-family parcel. In no instance shall a wall be permitted to be less than four (4') feet in height.

Section 2.01. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby given immediate effect pursuant to the provisions of Section 11 and Section 14 of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943 as amended.
