LWV Speaker To Discuss 'Adopt' Blind Poor of U. S. Korean Boy

Dr. Charles Lebeaux of Birmingham, professor of social work at Wayne State University, will address the League of Women Voters of Birmingham at a general meeting March 16. Dr. Lebeaux, who has published many books and papers on public assistance and other phases of the welfare field, was Fulbright research scholar in Italy, where he studied the relationship of industrialization to development of social welfare institutions. He is research consultant to the United Community Services committee on study of the aged and an executive board member of the University of Michigan School of Social Work Alumni Organization. With this meeting, the Welfare Committee is making its first report to the membership on the study which was adopted on a statewide basis at the convention last year.

"WE ARE learning that, unlike the poor in Africa and South America, the poor in the United States is nearly invisible," said Study Chairman Mrs. Robert Vanderbeek. "Although the general public has not mingled with the poor, they are very much aware that it is paying for them. The dollars spent for public welfare programs have aroused public opinion on all sides and put Newburgh, New York on the map. Attacks come from those who claim that welfare is a gigantic boonleaguer as well as those who are convinced that welfare budgets are too niggardly. The League is attempting to provide a sympathetic but objective appraisal of the facts."

Dr. Lebeaux will supply League members with a picture of how welfare is administered in other countries and give them his first-hand information on what welfare means to the people served. He will report on a recently completed study on Aid to Dependent Children recipients in Detroit, to focus on the human side of the welfare picture.

Agency President Speaks at OU

Four national leaders in life insurance agency management and the president of McManus, John and Adams advertising agency will be the speakers at an all-day Life Management Institute to be held April 8 at Oakland University. Luncheon speaker will be Ernest A.
