**New President Named at LIT**

Dr. Wayne H. Buell, executive vice president of Aristo International of Detroit, is the new president-elect of the Lawrence Institute of Technology, in Southfield. The announcement was made by Dr. E. George Lawrence, L.I.T.'s president for the past 30 years, who will become president emeritus on August 1 when Dr. Buell takes office as president.

The president-elect, a graduate of L.I.T. and Wayne State University, is a former L.I.T. professor of mathematics and chemistry.

HE WILL BE the third to head Lawrence Tech which was founded in 1932 by the late Dean Russell E. Lawrence and his brother George, who became president in 1934 upon the death of Dean Lawrence.

Dr. Buell, 51, of 28765 Sunset, Lathrup Village, is recognized internationally as an authority on the subject of core and binders, used in the foundry and sandcasting trade.


In complete command of their own equally exacting comedy roles were Elsie Garwood and Jean Marx, who coped with difficult drunk scenes and dialect convincingly.


