### Bechard to Chair Troy Arts Event

Joseph Bechard has been named honorary chairman for the 1964 Troy Arts Festival to be held at the Troy High School, June 20 and 21.

Bechard, now assistant principal at Troy High School, will assume new duties as principal beginning July 1.

Selection of Bechard as honorary chairman was based on the decision to use "The Teachers" as the theme for this year's Arts Festival. The festival will endeavor to point up the important role of the teacher in the lives of children, who are in the care of teachers for the major portions of their day, from the age of six.

BECHARD HAS BEEN a member of the Troy School System since 1937. He obtained his bachelor's degree from Michigan State University and his master's degree from Wayne State University.

The 1964 Troy Arts Festival is cosponsored by the Troy Arts Festival, Inc., president, Roy Barrett (an organization which includes representatives from the Friends of the Library, the PTA and the Troy Business and Professional Women's Club) and the Troy Drama Workshop.

Proceeds of the 1964 festival will be donated to the general fund of the Friends of the Troy Library.

The 1964 spring national bridge tournament was held at Portland and Dorothy Hayden, one of the top women's players in the country, held the hand that is reproduced today.

This is one way of obtaining a top board but is not recommended. Both vulnerable: Dealer: North. (Dealer) NORTH (Dorothy Hayden)

- WEST: ♠ A 10, ♥ 9 8 7 2, ♦ 10 9 4 3, ♣ 9 4 2
- EAST: ♠ 8 5 3, ♥ A 6 3, ♦ A 8 7, ♣ A Q 10 8
- SOUTH: ♥ 10 4, ♦ K J 5, ♣ K J 7 6 5 3

The bidding: NORTH EAST SOUTH WEST 1 NT pass 2 NT pass 3 NT all pass

Opening lead: 8 ♦ East decided to open with her weakest major to set up tricks in that suit for partner. When West played the ace of spades, Dorothy now saw that she had not sorted out her hand correctly and that she was void in clubs and had six spades, so to complete the idea, she dropped the nine of spades on the first trick and won the second trick with the king of spades.

The third trick was a heart, and when she knocked out the ace, East continued with the third spade, allowing Dorothy to make five no-trump, whereas the others were only able to make five spades.

THIS TOP BOARD did not bring Dorothy among the leaders in the first session of the woman's pair, but Mrs. E. Argustinger of Ann Arbor, playing with Mrs. Gordon of Buffalo, were second over all. 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
