

## Need Permit To Solicit, Says City

Charitable organizations seeking to campaign for funds in Birmingham are going to have to get a permit from the City before they can operate.

City commissioners Monday night approved the adoption of an ordinance requiring the issuance of permits to all solicitation drives. Assistant City Manager Robert S. Kenning said the new ordinance will result in the administration being aware of all solicitation going on in the city and will serve as a protection for residents against unauthorized drives.

The city manager will have control of the issuing of permits, but the granting of the permit will not be an endorsement of the organization by the City.

CHARITABLE, religious, patriotic, civic, educational or philanthropic organizations are all covered under the new ordinance.

However, the ordinance does not apply to solicitations conducted exclusively within the membership of an organization by its own officers and members.

A complete report on the purpose, time, officials and outline of methods to be used in conducting the solicitations must be furnished to the City before a permit can be issued.

The amount of wages, fees, commissions and expenses paid to persons involved in the solicitation must also be filed. No fee will be charged, however, for the issuing of the permit.

PERMIT APPLICATION procedures require submission of a financial statement for the preceding year and a statement that the applicant organization is tax exempt.

The new ordinance prevents solicitations from taking place before 8 a.m. and after 9 p.m.

If the city manager believes that the organization conducting a drive is misrepresenting facts or making untrue statements or has been in violation in obtaining the permit he may revoke the permit.

Organizations having their permits revoked may have a hearing before the city commission.

Tag days such as the annual poppy sale, Rotary newspaper sale and Kiwanis peanut sale will still require commission approval and will be limited to one such sale a month.

of apartments, shopping centers, individual stores, etc.

He is active in the Quanton Road Improvement Association. He and his wife, Carolyn, have six children.

"As a resident of Bloomfield Hills virtually since the early thirties, I have watched our city grow with keen interest," Pierce said.

"It has been a deep concern of mine to note how it is changing. I have always admired and believed in the policy of the late Lyman Craig that we retain Bloomfield Hills as a small suburban community."

"We are adjacent to numerous sprawling shopping centers, and I firmly believe it is in the best interest of our residents that we preserve our city as a beautiful and unspoiled residential area."

BERESFORD, connected for many years with Booth Newspapers, Inc., has served several terms as mayor since he was first elected in 1948.

Blanchard, seeking election to the unexpired year of Craig's term, is president of the Banner Laundry Co. of Detroit.

Beresford, Schirmer, Frye and Webb are vying for the two 2-year terms and Pierce will vie with Blanchard for the 1-year vacancy.
