During the evening, members exchanged flower catalogues in order to acquaint each other with new varieties.

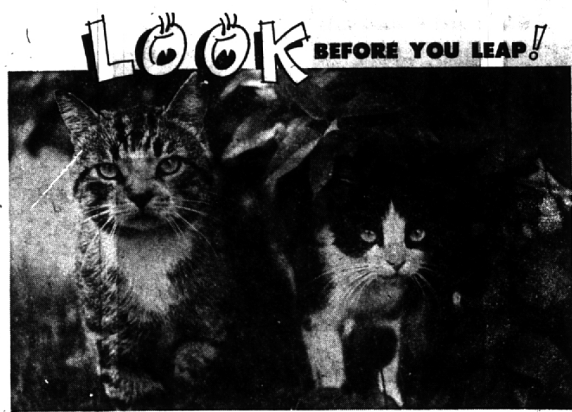
Serving as luncheon hostesses were Mrs. Harry Klimushyn, Mrs. Leon Mirbach, and Mrs. William DuCumb.
