Plans call for Mrs. Strom to coordinate requests from County Republicans for housing, tickets for the sessions of the convention, transportation information, and applications for jobs. According to Mrs. Strom, such positions as pages, assistant sergeants-at-arms and doorkeepers will be assigned equitably throughout the state and that persons desiring consideration should take action immediately.

In addition to coordinating the requests, Mrs. Strom indicated all individuals planning on attending the convention should contact her in order to be placed on the mailing list of people from Michigan.

The Republican National Convention is to be held in San Francisco beginning July 13.
